SERMON SNIPPET:

When You Hurt, I Hurt! 1 Corinthians 12:12-27 NRSV Rev. Dr. Anthony Hood

Take a moment to remember the last time you stubbed or hit your pinky toe in the middle of the night. For many of us we can instantly relive the painful moments that sent a shockwave of pain throughout our body. Depending on who was around, we may have expressed a few choice words. After concluding we hadn't broken it and that is wasn't bleeding, we wondered: How can something so small and seemingly insignificant cause us so much pain? Whatever the experience, we

have all had a moment where we learned how interconnected every part of our body really is. As people of faith, God reminds us through the apostle Paul, of how interconnect we are with one another and of the importance to come together in mutual respect and common purpose. Each member – whether new or old – of this body of Christ is important. For just like our pinky toe and paper cut remind us, when you hurt, I hurt.

In our text for this morning, we find Paul teaching an invaluable lesson to a trouble church. The letters of first and second Corinthians are Paul's efforts to help correct and instruct the Church at Corinth regarding the issues that were causing divisions amongst the gathered believers.

The church was experiencing tension and division based on who they were affiliated with: Paul or Peter. The church was experiencing division based on socio-economic class. The church was experiencing division based upon ethnic background. Paul writes to offer us sound instruction to transform our perception and perspectives, so that we might recognize how much we need each other. Paul uses the analogy of the human body to speak about the importance of each member of the body of Christ. Paul recognized and lifted the beauty of diversity working in harmony.

That although we are different, we are still invaluable parts of the body of Christ, brought to this local outpost of Heaven to be a blessing to those around us. Paul recognizes the health and healing that can be accomplished by a diverse group of people focuses on healing their spiritual, emotional, psychological scares and leading others to be healed by the love of Christ as well. For just as I hurt when you hurt. When you are healed, it helps me find healing as well, and that's what the body of Christ is supposed to be, a place of healing for all people.

seems like the Christmas Holidays ended day-


