Here's the gist of Haggai's message. Yes, the temple is not what it was before. Yes, your land is in ruins. Yes, you have significant obstacles. No, this is not an easy fix.

Do it anyway. Do it anyway and God will show up. In fact, God is already here. God is already present. You just have to be willing to participate in what God is calling you to do in this place and in this time. You can't go back to the way things were before. Solomon's temple is gone. Life as you knew it has changed. You didn't want to go through this but since you're going through it anyway, you might as well just lean into God. Haggai tells them the truth of their situation--they aren't giving priority to God. They are more focused on taking care of their personal lives, which frankly aren't going great either. But Haggai also tells them there is hope. Even with the risk, even with the difficult reality, there is hope for a future. This is what prophets do. The late Walter Brueggemann, an Old Testament scholar, would say that prophets have two main functions: To criticize and to energize. This is what Haggai is doing. He is criticizing the reality of people not being all-in on their spiritual lives. He is criticizing them giving into the local resistance. He is criticizing their spiritual apathy. But he is also energizing them by telling them that if they do this, God will be with them. He is energizing them with a new hope. He is energizing them with possibility. The temple of the future is going to be different than the temple of the past.

And, friends, the church was forever changed five years ago. Our church was changed. And it has been hard. I'm guessing it has been discouraging at times. Thousands of years ago, these people of faith were wondering if the temple still mattered. Does showing up for worship matter? Do my prayers matter? Does my giving matter? They were questioning if what they did still mattered. And Haggai tells them it not only matters, but it is crucial. And God is with you.

Friends, we have a God who shows up in the rubble. We have a God who isn't afraid of spiritual homes that have been brought down. In fact, it is often these types of situations where God can best become known because it is in these situations where we need God more than any other time. It is in these times where God calls us to lean in more than any other time. It is in these times where faith actually grows.

are available to Children in Kindergarten through Fifth Grades throughout the school year.



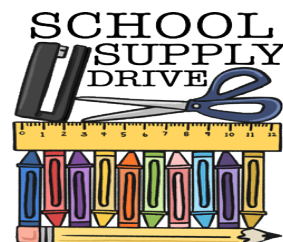
