Message: FASTING FOR PROTECTION

Scripture: Ezra 8:20-23 & Matthew 6:16-18 NRSV

All of us who have driven or ridden in an automobile have used a seatbelt. The three-point seatbelt design, widely used today, was patented by Volvo safety engineer Nils Bohlin in 1959. Seatbelts have been one of the simplest tools used to protect ourselves and our loved ones.

Modern cars have added a layer of protection with the advent of airbags. All these safety measures are designed to protect driver and passengers in case of an accident. Indeed, we don't know what awaits us when travelling in our vehicles, which encourages our use of devices for protection.

As followers of Christ who strive to live faithful and faith-filled lives, we recognize that the journey is peppered with unforeseen hardships and trials. Although we do not have a physical safety belt like automobiles, we are not sent into the world unprotected. God offers us the guidance of the Holy Spirit, discernment, and wisdom to help us navigate the uncertainties of life.

Fasting for protection allows us to refine our perception to better attune our hearts and minds to God's guidance.

In our text from Ezra, we find the writer calling for a fast of protection. The Old Testament can be divided into to The Law, The History, The Writings, and the Prophets. The book of Ezra is a part of the Old Testament History writings. Ezra's call for a fast for protection comes as they prepare to journey from Persia to Jerusalem. Ezra recognizes the journey will be arduous, but having neglected to secure an armed escort, Ezra turns toward a time of fasting. Fasting for protection, much like the poncho from our Children's message, seeks God's covering, provision, and nurturing despite our obstacles.

Our corporate fast is nearly upon us and preparations have been made; our fasting devotional guide is available on the website. There are three fasting options:

OPTION #1 – THE LIQUID FAST: You're asked to drink only water and tea during the fast.

OPTION #2 – THE RAW FRUIT & VEGETABLE FAST: You're asked to eat only fresh fruits, raw vegetables, and drink 100% fruit juice, or water.

OPTION #3 – THE PRAYER FAST: You're asked to fast from red meat, pork, complaining, or criticism and pray – prior to breakfast, lunch and dinner – for the duration of the fast.

I invite you to prayerfully consider participating in our Corporate Fast for God's guidance and forgiveness, as we seek God's favor for spiritually, numerically, and financially growth.





Virtual Rummage Sale Update 2024 eBay sales for 2024 totaled about \$4,976. with 166 transactions and 3 returned items. 
