Why did Jesus choose to be baptized? He could have just started healing people. He could have just started preaching. But he chose to be baptized by another person just like us. Okay John the Baptist had a gnarly beard and ate bugs so he wasn't just like us, but he was allegedly human. And the man who had divinity coursing through his body, chose to be baptized by him. Why?

People have had a lot of thoughts about this over the years. Here's where I currently stand. First, I find it fascinating the location of this baptism. Current Structure

CHURCH COUNCIL: The main governing body of the church.

STAFF-PARISH RELATIONS COMMITTEE: The SPRC serves as the go-between of the congregation, the staff and appointed clergy. They handle personnel decisions and provide support and accountability for clergy and staff.

TRUSTEES: The stewards of property God has entrusted to the congregation. This includes supervising and maintaining both the physical property of the congregation and gifts made to the congregation so that the ministries of the congregation can be effective and all legal requirements related to the property are satisfied.

FINANCE: The committee on finance shall be charged with responsibility for developing and implementing plans that will raise sufficient income to meet the budget adopted by the church council. It shall administer the funds received according to instructions from the church council.

NOMINATIONS: Chaired by the appointed clergy, this team helps discern and nominate individuals for committees. However, they are not able to self-nominate unless the pastor and team agree.

MINISTRY TEAMS: These are the teams that make our church go. They are the boots on the ground who do the ministry of the church.
